Listening to support Rural Mission

The Lightwave team have been seeking to listen to rural churches and communities about where they would like help in reaching out – this is what we have heard so far:

Many churches also tell us that they are good at building relationships in villages but find encouraging new Christian commitment more difficult, so we are particularly focussing on how we can support you in making new disciples. South Hartismere is a rural multi-parish benefice re-shaping itself for mission through Lightwave Connect – a weekly fresh expression of church, engaging and reaching out within the local community. "Lightwave has built on our existing outreach through Connect, a fluid session of crafts, table talk, prayer activities, Connect outdoors and finishing with a short act of worship," says Revd Canon Julia Lall. "Through the pandemic we have been able to grow through a weekly Facebook post, Connect@home,

Pilgrims Together is a community-based group with Christ at its heart. It seeks to provide opportunities to share faith and fellowship in the local community
